<u>Bagsgarth Sports Partnership</u> <i>(These two are the same thing, but this payment was taken from this year's budget)</i>	£2500	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>CPD - Specialist Support Day from School's Sports Leader</u> – Modelled four Outdoor Adventurous Activities PE lessons for four teachers, after staff audit highlighted that this was the area where they felt the least confident. The impact of this on children is that staff are more highly skilled to plan and teach Outdoor Adventurous Activities lessons. • <u>Access to Sporting Events</u> – Children are able to participate in competitive sporting events at Brumby Outwood Academy against others schools in the Cluster. E.g. Benchball, Dodgeball. • <u>Support for PE Lead</u> – The PE lead has sought support from School's Sports Co-ordinator in the partnership. This has impacted the children because it is ensuring that the children are being given as many great opportunities as possible. • <u>PE Forum Meetings</u> – Opportunity for PE lead to meet other PE Leads. These meetings are enabling me, as the PE lead, to share great practice from other PE leads in the cluster. For example, another PE lead modelled his way of tracking the children's participation in sporting activities throughout their school in order to provide evidence for the Games Mark Award. I have also been shown scrapbooks which are used in another school to track the coverage of PE throughout the year and each class' success and achievements. I was introduced me to the idea of inter-house sporting competitions which is something that I would like to implement within the school. • <u>PE Scheme</u> – Skills-Based Scheme for whole-school to follow. Children can develop their skills through their PE lessons in order to later apply these to Sports Games in some cases.
