This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

- St Peter and St Paul CE Primary school offer each year group a curriculum music lesson each week.
- Music lessons are taught by a music specialist in KS1 and KS2.
- Our curriculum overview can be found on the school website.
- The Model Music Curriculum inspired our curriculum, which is informed by the non-statutory National Curriculum Guidance.
- Singing worships are held each week and singing is part of worship every day.
- We offer instrumental lessons for strings and woodwind where pupils can enter ABRSM exams and take part in local festivals.

Part B: Co-curricular music

- The school has two dedicated music specialists who encourage children at the school to join extra curriculum activities organised by the music hub. This includes the music services music centre where they can join various ensembles.
- St Peter and St Paul CE Primary will have a choir, instrumental ensemble and Taiko group for the 2024-2025 academic year.
- We encourage instrumental lessons in strings and woodwind. Woodwind is taught by a visiting peripatetic teacher from the music service. Strings are taught by one of the specialist music teachers. This paid for by parents. Children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding can be supported in this.
- There are other opportunities for children to learn in year 4 through Fredissimo. This is a project that is run jointly by Fred Gough school a local secondary school and the music Hub. There is also an opportunity to join a youth folk ensemble through Folklinks.
- The school choir and instrumental ensemble perform at school events, the local care home and in the local Church.

Part C: Musical experiences

- The instrumentalists, ensemble and choir are all encouraged to perform in worship whenever they wish and they are invited on a regular basis to perform at our local church.
- St Peter and St Paul CE Primary School encourages all instrumentalists and groups to enter two local music festivals. The North Lincolnshire Music and Drama festival and Scunthorpe Music Festival.
- The school also host a concert at least once a year for parents.
- There are other opportunities through the Hub to take part in play days and KS1 and KS2 big sings.
- Humber Taiko organise an annual festival which the school takes part in and a group take part in.
- Young Voices concert at the arena in Sheffield each year.
- Frederick Gough, one of the local secondary schools, bring their band to perform at the school for the whole school to watch.

In the future

- Expand the provision for instrumentalists.
- Make the choir larger
- Develop other groups - eg have a recorder group and a ukulele group.
- We would also like to bring more professional musicians in to school to inspire and encourage the children to take up an instrument or join a choir.
