WIDER CURRICULUM

It has been a busy few weeks in school at the start of this year, with lots of events happening outside of normal lessons, which enhance our curriculum for the children. Mini First-Aid have led sessions with some classes already this term and will continue to do so. As part of inter-faith week children are taking part in visits to different places of worship linked to different faiths to develop their understanding and respect for other faiths. All the Spring term clubs are underway – with lots of great things happening for fitness, music and creative opportunities. We also have in school hands on workshops for Year 5 and 6 linked to their topic of Ancient Greece and Year 1 and 2 linked to Florence Nightingale. All to bring the children's learning to life.

MINI FIRST AID

This term all our children have completed mini-first aid sessions and learnt vital life skills which could save lives. Could parents and carers please ensure:

Online safety is part of the curriculum through computing lessons and PSHE lessons on a regular basis. ATTENDANCE

We are committed to providing high quality education for all our children. In order for a child to reach their full potential, we expect a high level of school attendance. Holidays in term time are unauthorised, unless in exceptional circumstances and referred to the Education Inclusion Service, who may issue a Penalty Notice or prosecution.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are offered to children of families who receive one of the following: Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, Income Support, Income-based Job Seekers Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, The guarantee element of Pension Credit, Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit), Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190.
